ORDINANCE 931

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBITING ANIMALS FROM BECOMING
A NUISANCE IN THE VILLAGE OF PLEASANT HILL

WHEREAS, the Village Council has had difficulty with animals becoming a nuisance;

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Village of Pleasant Hill, a majority of the members elected or appointed thereto concurring.

SECTION ONE: That Section 1030 of the Code of Ordinances of the Village of Pleasant Hill be amended as follows:

1030 Loud Animal. No owner, keeper, or harbinger of a ANY ANIMAL shall permit or allow such it ANIMAL to annoy or disturb one or more of the inhabitants of 2 or more separate residences of this municipality by frequent or habitual howling, yelping, barking, or making of any other such noises by such it ANIMAL within the corporate limits.

Penalty, see Title Ten, Chapter 3, 1070

SECTION TWO: This ordinance shall take affect and be enforced from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

SECTION THREE: That this Ordinance be and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Ohio for the aforementioned reasons and therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
