

VILLAGE OF PLEASANT HILL, OHIO

ORDINANCE 934

AN ORDINANCE TO PROHIBIT PARKING A TRAILER, MOTOR HOME, HOUSE TRAILER OR BOAT ON ANY VILLAGE STREET AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the parking of trailers, motor homes, house trailers and boats parked on village streets is a safety hazard, and;

WHEREAS, the parking of trailers, motor homes, house trailers and boats parked on village streets is esthetically undesirable.

BE IT ORDAINED, by the Council of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Miami County, Ohio:

SECTION ONE: That no person shall park a trailer, motor home, house trailer or boat on any street in the village of Pleasant Hill except for loading and unloading purposes.

SECTION TWO: That any person who owns a trailer, motor home, house trailer or boat that is left unattended for more than 24 hours on any street will be presumed to be in violation of this ordinance.

SECTION THREE: That any violation of this ordinance shall be a minor misdemeanor punishable by a fine of not more than one hundred dollars (\$100.00). Each 24-hour period of violation constitutes a separate offense.

SECTION FOUR: That all ordinances or resolutions in conflict with this Ordinance are hereby repealed.

SECTION FIVE: That this Ordinance be and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Ohio for the reason that said Ordinance will alleviate an unsafe condition that occurs on an ongoing basis and therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.
