Village Office Update:

Mr. Marko reported on the meeting with Mr. Pat McBride and Bryce Baker on the problems with the utility billing system. everything has been corrected and future utility bills could be higher.

Old Business:

The Board discussed that the undercharging for Water and Sewer on the School's utility bills from 2011 forward was no fault of theirs. The blame all falls on the Village and the software vendor. It was brought to the Board's attention that currently Newton School does not pay sewer fees for the Concession Stand account. The meter measures the water used for the concession stand, the rest rooms at the ball fields and the sprinkling system for the two diamonds. After a lengthy discussion; Kory moved to charge Newton Schools the minimum sewer fee whenever any water consumption is recorded on the meter. Von seconded the motion.
