Village Water

The Village takes a proactive approach in monitoring and mitigating the presents of rust in discolored water. The water quality and chlorine level are tested frequently.

There still, on occasion, may be a rusty water problem in certain areas. Most of the water mains in the distribution system have been updated to PVC or ductile iron (which are lined). A small amount of cast iron pipes are still present, and like anything made of iron, are subject to rusting.

We are presently working on a program to replace the remaining cast mains, adding flushing hydrants and eliminating dead-end lines. We also flush the fire hydrants at least once a year to remove any rusty water due to the peculiarities of water chemistry. If you do experience a rusty water problem, please call us so that we can attempt to pinpoint the problem and take corrective action. 937-676-3321

Recycle Schedule as of 2/26/2026



Through Holidays, sub zero temperatures, and a foot of lingering snow, Reliable has gotten through it, with all the resident's help.

Everyone should have the bins that they need, above is the recycle schedule to follow per your location to the Monument.

A few reminders:

All trash must be inside bins for regular weekly pickup. Large pickups must be scheduled (see bulk item collection below).

Bins are to be out Thursday evening – they follow the weather and start early. Recycle and trash are not picked up at the same time.

LIST OF ACCEPTABLE RECYCLING ITEMS:

- Glass bottles & jars (all colors)
- Steel cans
- Aluminum cans and cups
- Plastic bottles
- Plastic tubs
- Plastic cups
- Plastic clamshell containers
- Paper
- Cartons
- Cardboard

Bulk Item Collection – Are Residents limited in quantity for each pick up? Is there a call ahead policy? Can you provide a list of acceptable and unacceptable items?

Each household may place out one large item (e.g., couch, large table, full-size recliner, or mattress wrapped in plastic); or two smaller items (e.g., end tables, small chairs, or similar) per collection.

Unacceptable Items:

Anything containing hazardous material
Anything containing Freon

Bulk collection will occur on the second Friday of each month, along with trash service.

Electric Aggregation

The new electric supplier is with Dynegey Energy Services beginning with the December 2025 meter read date at a fixed rate of **9.59 cents per kWh**, until the December 2026 meter read date. While the 12-month offer is slightly higher than the current SSO rate, future SSO rates beyond May 2026 are not yet known. There is no early termination fee. The Village of Pleasant Hill is included in the Electric Aggregation Program.

Natural Gas Aggregation

The County renewed with IGS Energy for a 24-month term at a fixed rate of **\$6.82 per MCF** (\$0.682 per ccf) starting with the November 2025 billing. There is no early termination fee.

The Village of Pleasant Hill Cemetery would like to remind all concerned parties that the deadline for cemetery clean-up is March 15th. All decorations on the grounds after that date will be discarded. New arrangements may be placed at the gravesites but must follow cemetery guidelines.

No glass containers, no planting of flowers, shrubs, or trees without permission. If you are using a monument mounted saddle, please mount them securely and put the name of the deceased on the bottom of the saddle so they can be easily identified if they are blown off.
