

**VILLAGE OF PLEASANT HILL
ORDINANCE NO. 1129**

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR MOBILE
FOOD VEHICLE OPERATING IN THE VILLAGE OF PLEASANT HILL, MIAMI
COUNTY, OHIO**

WHEREAS, Council of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Miami County, Ohio has deemed it necessary to require authorizing and regulated mobile food within the village.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Council of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Miami County, Ohio, two-thirds or more of the members elected or appointed thereto concurring that:

SECTION ONE: As used in this section, “Mobile Food Vehicle” shall mean a retail food business that is not intended to be permanent and is a motorized wheeled vehicle, or a trailer that is licensed for use on public roadways, designed and equipped to serve food or beverages.

SECTION TWO: Scope. The operation of a Mobile Food Vehicle is permitted provided that such operation is in compliance with all requirements and limitations contained in this section.

SECTION THREE: License Required. A mobile retail food service license issued by the County Health Department is required and must be conspicuously displayed at all times during the operation of a Mobile Food Vehicle.

SECTION FOUR: Time of Operation. Except on days where the Village imposes restrictions, Mobile Food Vehicles may only operate in areas designated as Special (S), Business (B-1) and Manufacturing/Industrial (M) Zoning between the hours of 7: 00a.m and 10:00pm Sunday through Thursday, and 7:00am – 11:00pm on Friday and Saturday. The Mobile Food Vehicle must be removed from its location daily when not in operation.

SECTION FIVE: Location Requirements. A Mobile Food Vehicle may operate on private property with the consent of the owner in accordance with the following restrictions: Minimum of 175 feet distance from a restaurant, while the restaurant is open for business, as measured from the property line of the operating restaurant to the closest point of the Mobile Food Vehicle.

SECTION SIX: Operations. Mobile Food Vehicles may only serve customers from an adjacent sidewalk or the curbside of the vehicle. In the absence of a sidewalk or curb, customers may only be served from the side of the Mobile Food Vehicle that is furthest from the area of right-of-way customarily used for a motor vehicle travel.

SECTION SEVEN: Littering and Trash Removal. Mobile Food Vehicle operators must keep the areas surrounding their vehicle and all other spaces adjacent to the business site clean and free of refuse of any kind generated from the operation of their business.

SECTION EIGHT: Penalty. A violation of any provision of this ordinance is a minor misdemeanor for each offense. A citation under this section shall automatically suspend operation of the Mobile Food Vehicle and all operations shall cease conducting business until the violation is alleviated.
