

VILLAGE OF PLEASANT HILL, OHIO

ORDINANCE 998

**AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING PERFORMING REPAIR OR MAINTENANCE WORK
ON ANY MOTOR VEHICLE ON VILLAGE STREETS AND HIGHWAYS**

WHEREAS, Ordinance 457 does not adequately meet the needs for regulating the performance of repair or maintenance work on motor vehicles within the Village limits; and

WHEREAS, the penalty provided in Ordinance 457 does not meet the current penal standards for the State of Ohio.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED by the council of the Village of Pleasant Hill, a majority of the members elected or appointed thereto concurring.


SECTION ONE: No person shall use the streets and highways of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Ohio, for the purpose of the performance of repair or maintenance work on any motor vehicle except for such minor emergency repairs which may be necessary to move or remove stalled vehicles.

SECTION TWO: A violation of this Ordinance is a minor misdemeanor. Each day during which such violation continues shall constitute a separate offense. This Ordinance shall become a part of the codified Ordinances of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Ohio, upon it being passed into law, and upon the earliest time allowed by law.


SECTION THREE: That this Ordinance be and is hereby declared to be an emergency measure for the immediate preservation of the health, welfare, and safety of the citizens of the Village of Pleasant Hill, Ohio for the reason that Ordinance 457 does not adequately meet the needs for regulating the performance of repair or maintenance work on motor vehicles within the Village limits and the Village will be without means to enforce the Ordinance affecting the safety of the Village, therefore, this Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage.


